

Pupil Premium - Impact Assessment 2013-14

- GCSE exam results showed that PP students have continued a 3-year trend of **improved achievement**

YEAR	% 5A*- G (E&M)
2013/14	93%
2012/13	96%
2011/12	75%

- GCSE exam results showed that PP students are **making more progress**.

YEAR	% making expected levels of progress - ENGLISH	% making expected levels of progress - MATHS
2013/14	54%	46%
2012/13	35%	40%
2011/12	18%	36%

- GCSE exam results showed a **narrowing of the gap** between PP and non-PP students.

2012/13	41%	2%

- End of KS3 results** show improved rates of progress

YEAR	Expected progress for PP students at end of KS3 - ENGLISH	Expected progress for PP students at end of KS3 - MATHS
2013/14	51%	76%
% Increase on 2012/13	↑ 16%	↑ 4%

- **Attendance** for PP students **has increased**

YEAR	Attendance of PP students
2013/14	88.1% [93.4% for Yr 8 cohort]
2012/13	87.3%
2011/12	86.6%

- **Attendance** figures show a **narrowing of the gap** between PP and Non-PP students.

YEAR	% Attendance gap between PP & Non-PP students
2013/14	6%
2012/13	6.8%
2011/12	7.4%

- **Fixed Term Exclusions** for PP students **have reduced**

YEAR	% Fixed Term Exclusions for PP students
2013/14	19%
2012/13	27%
2011/12	25%

- **Reading test data** for September showed that 51% of Y7 PP students had a reading age at or above the national benchmark. In June this had increased to 54%. In Y8, the figures show that in September 55% reached the benchmark, and by June this had increased to 66%.
