As part of a short service in the courtyard, 1000 students and staff observed the traditional 11th November two-minute period of remembrance at 11:00am. The Last Post was played by Reuben, Alex and Dexter and this was followed by our Head Student, Bella, reading the poem 'In Flanders Fields' by John McCrae.

This came after JMS students representing local cadet groups laid a wreath at the War Memorial in Abingdon on Friday on behalf of the whole JMS community, and many more members of our community paid their respects as part of the Abingdon memorial service on Sunday. All week students have been learning about the 300 young men from Abingdon who lost their lives in the First World War and it has been an important week for everyone to be grateful and proud to live in a country were democracy, tolerance, respect, liberty and the rule of law are so highly valued.

This week has also been anti-bullying week and I would like to express my thanks to all of our anti-bullying ambassadors for the work they have done to raise the profile of this important cause from wearing odd socks to selling wrist bands. In addition to the quiz, there was a second hand book stall, games and challenges. Drinks as well as hot and cold snacks were also appreciated.


The total amount raised was £257.51 which all goes towards the Welsh Farm borehole appeal.

STEM club






Anti-Bullying Week

With such a high standard, two posters were joint 2nd place.




