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

School News


Vertex Pharmaceuticals Year 10 trip

Across January our year 10 students have been visiting Vertex Pharmaceuticals to learn about sickle cell anaemia. Their day started with discussions around different diseases the students had already learnt. They then were invited into the laboratory to see sickle red blood cells under the microscopes. The students were fascinated to see the difference between normal red blood cells, and red blood cells affected by sickle cell anaemia. The students were taught how to use Micro Pipettes by practicing using them on a guide. Once the students were confident in using the laboratory equipment, they learnt the stages involved in testing human DNA for the sickle cell gene using gel electrophoresis. The students set up their own gel electrophoresis and tested real DNA for sickle cell anaemia. They were able to see who out of the 4 family members had sickle cell anaemia and who were carriers or not affected.

The day was fascinating and very interesting for both students and teachers. We look forward to taking our year 9 students in the spring.
