Mobile phones are confiscated if they are seen or heard by a member of staff and in 76% of cases students have not repeated the mistake and when comes to repeating the mistake twice this increases to 91%. For the small number of students who then need it, we are able to offer additional support to break habits.

On Tuesday a <u>BBC news article</u> pointed out that banning phones in school is not enough, and that we need your help to ensure mobile phones don't have a negative impact on students grades or their mental wellbeing.

You can help us by doing the following:
