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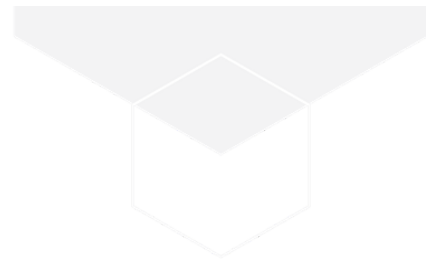
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It is vitally important that students attend these sessions to receive daily information about important events in school, including recognition events. They will continue the JMS reads programme which has now moved to the morning session.

Sometimes there are issues that students experience which we don't see and students may not feel like they can or are able to speak to a member of staff. In these instances students can use the "[Whisper form](#)". This alerts us to the issue so that we can investigate.

We have now moved to using days absent from school, rather than percentages, when discussing and communicating attendance to school. This system is easier to understand and highlights that every day in school matters. The days when the school was closed to your child's year group did not count as absence, therefore attendance has remained unaffected.
