Dear families

We have reached the end of Term 3 with plenty to celebrate. Year 7 attended the Big Reveal event in the Main Hall where we announced the winners of the House Point Competition for Term 3 as well as celebrating many exceptional achievements.

Throughout term 3 John Mason Students could be seen winning or taking part in 12 tournaments or matches in football, basketball and netball, the Oxfordshire County Cross Country Competition, attending trips to the Maths department at the University of Oxford, the design competition 'Made in Oxford at the Westgate, InspirEd at OX14, and Vertex labs. In school 43 students achieved a combination of Bronze Silver and Gold certificates as part of the Intermediate Maths Challenge, and 7 of them were selected to take part in the next round.

We also celebrated a huge number of House Points earned by students, both inside the classroom and out. Students have displayed positive attitudes to the wide range of opportunities they are given and have consistently demonstrated the habits of determination and respect throughout their school days. We reached 100,000 House Points at the end of January, but the total now stands at and incredible 120,291. As we move into term 4 it is the turn of Stert House to hold the House Cup for earning the highest number of house points in term 3 and the cup was presented to Stert House representatives during our Big Reveal on Friday afternoon.



We are more than halfway through the school year now with lots to look forward to in the second half. I hope you all manage a peaceful break over half term, and we look forward to seeing you back on Monday 24th February.
