Parent Voice Survey

In October we asked you to complete our Parent Voice survey which included several questions about the impact of mobile phones on the wellbeing of our students and the running of the school.

We have compared your views with those you shared with us earlier in 2024 and it is good to see that the percentages of students who are happy, feel safe and are doing well in school have all gone up. You have also told us that you have a better understanding of how your child is doing in school.

In your comments you told us that you were very pleased with recent staffing appointments, and you had noticed the impact of new members of staff in school on your child's experience in school.

You told us that better management of behaviour is beginning to have a positive impact on lessons, but we recognise that we still have work to do here. You have shared with us some frustrations around SEND provision, and I want to let you know that we are increasing our SEND staffing, and I hope you will continue to see this provision improve.

You told us that you have noticed high quality homework is being set more consistently and you have asked us for a guide to the different online platforms we use for homework and how to access them. This guide is in development, and we aim to share it with you in the new year.

Finally, you shared your concerns, as well as the benefits around Smart Phones. Many of you have requested more guidance around mobile phones and later in this bulletin you will find a poster advertising free webinars by Thame Valley Police for parents and carers on how to keep your child safe on line.

We are and will remain a mobile phone free school. Students are asked to turn their mobile phones off and keep them out of sight when they arrive at school. If a mobile phone is seen or heard in school it will be confiscated and if a phone is confiscated on a second occasion, we will request that a family member comes into school to collect the phone from reception.
