

Job Description – Teacher of Computing

Job purpose:

- To fully support the Head of Department in continuing to raise attainment and achievement in Computing
- To effectively support the development of the Computing Department throughout the school and inspire pupils and staff with strong subject knowledge and a passion for learning
- To promote and support extra-curricular activities as part of the academic and cultural life of the school.
- To attend and contribute to Computing department meetings and other meetings as appropriate
- To foster good relationships with students and with home, including attendance at parent-teacher consultations.
- To maintain personal knowledge and competence by keeping abreast of suitable CPD opportunities in order to establish an exemplar of best practice.
